
*The following books are only recommendations; students may read any appropriate book for their summer reading project. Parents, please review any book your child chooses to read.

Ms. Galm (8th Grade Teacher) The Hitchhiker's Guide to the by Douglas Adams






Ms. Killian (Reading Teacher)

But for America Singer, being Selected is a nightmare...







Mrs. Ginsburg (7th Grade Teacher) Lockdown: Escape From Furnace by Alexander Gordon Smith

Furnace Penitentiary is the world's most secure prison for young offenders. Sentenced to life without parole for a murder he didn't commit, Alex Sawyer knows he has two choices: find a way out, or resign himself to a death, in the darkness at the bottom of the world. Soon Alex discovers that the prison is a place of pure evil, where inhuman creatures in gas masks stalk the corridors at night, where giants in black suits drag screaming inmates into the shadows, where deformed beasts can be heard howling from the blood-drenched tunnels below. And behind everything is the mysterious, all-powerful warden, a man as cruel and dangerous as the devil himself...

Together with a bunch of inmates—some innocent kids who have been framed, others cold-blooded killers—Alex plans an escape. But as he starts to uncover the truth about Furnace's deeper, darker purpose, Alex's actions grow ever more dangerous, and he must risk everything to expose this nightmare that's hidden from the eyes of the world.

Unwind by Neal Shusterman

A new law is made: The Bill of Life states that human life may not be touched from the moment of conception until a child reaches the age of thirteen. Between the ages of thirteen and eigher the age. a parent may choose to retroactively get rid of a child through a process called "unwinding." Unwinding ensures that the child's life doesn't "technically" end by transplanting all the organs in the child's body to various recipients. Now troublesome or unwanted teens are able to easily be unwound.

This book follows three teens who all become runaway Unwinds: Connor, a rebel whose parents have ordered his unwinding; Risa, a ward of the state who is to be unwound due to cost-cutting; and Lev, his parents' tenth child whose unwinding has been planned since birth as a religious tithing. As their paths intersect thier lives hang in the balance.
