SEMESTER ELECTIVES – ART

Art Foundations

Explore a variety of art materials, develop art techniques, and use creative thinking skills to express ideas and viewpoints about personal experiences and the world. Produce meaningful and unique drawings, paintings, prints, sculptures, ceramics and crafts in a studio setting.

Computers in Art

Integrate the computer and associated technology with traditional art media and practices. Work with a variety of software applications including Adobe Photoshop and Adobe Illustrator to explore subjects, ideas and themes related to living in the world. Prior computer experience is not required

SEMESTER ELECTIVES – ART

3D Art Exploration

Work in the third-dimension by creating sculptures, ceramic objects, models and installations that express ideas about personal experiences and observations of the world. Learn to use a variety of art media, non-traditional materials, tools and equipment to compose, construct, and form functional and decorative artworks. Build knowledge, refine skills, improve techniques, and craftsmanship to meet challenges and solve problems in unique ways.

Art Extensions

SEMESTER ELECTIVES – PERFORMING ARTS

Theatre Appreciation (and Advanced) – Semester

This is an introductory course for students who are interested in learning about the history and modern practices of the working theatre. Emphasis is on ensemble based performances, risk taking, and self-discovery.

Technical Theatre Arts Appreciation-Semester

Students develop an appreciation of technical theatre, including lighting, sound, scenery, costumes, and stage management. Students will develop skills in listening, collaborating, and discussing in group situations. Students will explore and design technical theatre elements.

SEMESTER ELECTIVES —BUSINESS AND TECHNOLOGY

Computer Solutions

Project based learning to teach practical computer skills. Students experiment with a variety of applications and how they can be used for presentations and data.

Coding and Innovative Technologies (NEW!)

This course introduces student to coding and emerging technology through hands-on projects. Students learn coding concepts and use technology to compete in projects. Students should be competent in computer basics as well as MS Word, PowerPoint, Excel and Internet research.

SEMESTER ELECTIVES —BUSINESS AND TECHNOLOGY

Engineering Simulation and Fabrication (Tech Explorations 8)

This course is all about exploring through designing, building, testing and evaluating technology systems. Learn to use Computer Aided Drafting as you design a catapult, make a working model and test to see how accurate it is at hitting a target. Use Computers to control machines and make products. Challenge yourself with a problem solving activity that has limitless solutions. All you have to bring is your imagination and enthusiasm to learn.

SEMESTER ELECTIVES —CONTINUED

Family and Consumer Sciences

Students apply cooking techniques to creating recipes that will help them maintain their physical well-being. They will learn about childcare and the importance of maintaining their clothing and personal environment. Student will explore careers while developing their leadership and responsibility skills. Students will practice the appropriate communication skills needed to maintain their personal safety and help them succeed in their lifetime.

SEMESTER ELECTIVES - CONTINUED

Peer Helping

This course is designed to train and facilitate a peer helper program where students have an opportunity to develop their support and leadership skills in assisting others. Students are taught to help peers by learning to be more effective listeners, developing friendship skills, becoming group leaders, and being positive role models. Course topics may include self-esteem and self-exploration, goal setting, school success skills, effective communication skills, peer refusal skills, substance abuse prevention, and decision-making and problem-solving techniques.
